#### vocal art

Christian Wolz combines new styles of singing and language with the musical structures of medieval and non- European cultures to form a new means of communication for avant-garde art, hereby applying electro-acoustic means. Originally intended as tools for assistance, things such as microphones and effect processors become unique musical instruments. His way of working uses both methods of composition and improvisation combined into one. The result is a huge room of association where communication is developed as a deep, emotional and pristine form of conveyance. Christian Wolz's vocal art is a self-developed vocal technique borrowed from forms of glossolalia (speaking in tongues). Glossolalia stems from the field of the psychology and is a self-created language of symbols, new word creations (neologism) and lingual sounds. The combination of such avant-garde vocal techniques with conventional styles of music makes his compositions one of a kind.

Christian Wolz is not a vocal performing show-off, but rather a convinced artist in a symbiosis of art forms: photographer, instrumentalist, singer, actor and director all in one. For years Christian Wolz has been fine-tuning his own form of expression. Bizarre, avant-garde, experimental, emotional and intimate. An allegory of his soul and his life. Living in Berlin, his work deals with the cycle of birth, life and death. Regardless of whether its a performance on stage, a photo exhibition or a CD, every artistic detail is a facet of this basic theme and is embedded into his complete works, which deal with daily existence and its customary madness.

# biography

Since 1988 Christian Wolz created numerous concerts, vocal performances, sound installations, radio plays, Cd's and multimedia-performances. In 1995 he founded "Wolz – New Music Theatre" and collaborated with various musicians, choreographers and directors. He created compositions for dance companies and theatre productions. He performed and worked in Germany, Austria, Switzerland, Netherlands, Poland, Belgium, Luxemburg, France, Greece, UK, Spain, Italy, Denmark, Canada and New Zealand.

## stage echoes

It's unbelievable what this man's got in his throat -weeping children, buzzing saws, medieval monks, tortured victims, Arabian lamentation. Of course with a little help of modern technology. But whoever has the opportunity to listen to a Christian Wolz vocal performance would probably think that this man's got at least four vocal cords. Christian Wolz moans and groans, screams and whimpers, hackles, coos, wails and grumbles, and adds his own sound mixes ranging from ambient to touches of Arabian or Gregorian chanting. crying animal • Christian Wolz turns every cavity of his body into a musical sound box. Once he's found his rhythm, the whisper of the softest breath can turn into a last desperate scream. The 30year-old has created a huge spectrum of musical forms of expression. Often his exhausting vocal experiments darkened by a touch of doom have been compared to Diamanda Galas' heavily orgiastic style. However this comparison suffocates Wolz' search for authenticity. Wolz treads new paths and opens the spectrum of sensual perception to take in more of life. Electronic voice processing creates such a thick sound reminding one of an opera in a dramatic and overkill kind of way.

Hey, there's someone screaming out all the suffering of the world - vibrating vocal cords singing tenor, bass and countertenor all in one, reaching dizzying heights and ecstatic depths. Wolz is an exceptional soul in the deep valley of male singers in a vocal landscape in which usually only women live and work. He doesn't really fit in anywhere - he left behind the dark wave and gothic scene long ago, and in the avant-garde scene his extreme emotional outbursts strike light lightning, leaving behind perplexed faces.

#### (Jazzthetik)

Wolz creates an extremely effective relationship between the photographs and his person. He provokes voyeurism and sexual attraction while at the same time appearing open and vulnerable. His vocal work remains in the foreground, ranging from animalistic grunting to imploring melismatic singing to cries of desperation. With the help of studio recording and technology, his voice is distorted and multiplied in an orchestral effect, and the highly subjunctive release of his sensations embodies the quality in addition to his sensory power of incredible authenticity.
